

**Focus Area: School-wide Behavior Expectations
CAFETERIA**

Objective:

To teach the students how to be respectful, responsible, and safe while in the cafeteria for breakfast and lunch.

Materials Needed:

- paper
- pens/pencils
- whiteboard markers

How are we going to teach the expectations?

- Have students get into groups of four or five and give them a blank sheet of paper.
- Have them write Cafeteria in the middle of the paper to create a Bubble Map.
- *Without talking*, tell the students to write down as many rules, expectations, and good examples as possible, in regards to the cafeteria. (5 mins)
- Write Cafeteria/Lunchroom on your white board and circle it.
- **Contest:** Each group will be given a dry erase marker and will assign a recorder (or you can tell the students they will take turns writing on the board). Call a group up one at a time to write something down on the board that they have on their paper. Once a group reaches the board call up another group.
 - After a couple rounds you may want to speed up the game a bit, by calling groups up a little faster.
 - If a group is passed or writes down something that is already on the board they are disqualified. Last group standing is the winner.
- Discuss their responses and have them give examples of their responses.
